How to Write an Essay Conclusion

Conclusion

- Reconnect to the introduction
- Summarize the evidence
- Leave memorable message for the reader

First, bring the reader back to the introduction by reconnecting to a statement made there.

Example: Is the cost of safety worth the price a company must pay to ensure safety?

Second, summarize the evidence presented in the body paragraphs.

Example: The evidence provided in the examples of the Three Mile Island Nuclear Generating Station and Union Carbide would suggest that safety is worth the price.

Third, leave the reader with a memorable message or a call to action, for your final words are what the reader will take away from the paper.

Example: Certainly if the lives of one's loved ones or of oneself are at stake, safety is worth whatever it costs, so it is the responsibility of every worker to identify and eliminate safety hazards in the workplace.

Now, observe how the three parts go together in the conclusion.

Is the cost of safety worth the price a company must pay to ensure safety? The evidence provided in the examples of the Three Mile Island Nuclear Generating Station and Union Carbide would suggest that safety is worth the price.
